Blue Whale Game

We need to alert you to information from The Safeguarding Sheffield Children Board (SSCB) who have circulated information about this game currently being reported in the media. Whilst we do not want to be alarmist, we want to draw your attention to this potential threat and ask that parents and carers are aware that your child could be subject to receiving such challenges on social media after downloading the app.

This challenge is trending on Twitter and featuring on Instagram and Facebook.

In the game players are appointed a 'master' or 'teacher' who challenges them to self tattoo a blue whale on their body. The game then escalates with increasing levels of self-harm encouraged.
