



# Behaviour Improvement System

### Remind

- You will receive a reminder from your teacher to help you change your behaviour.
- At this stage you will not receive any behaviour points.
- If your behaviour doesn't improve the formal behaviour system will begin.

Warn

- 1 Behaviour point
- Logged on your profile
- Strategies used to prevent need for restorative.
- Student given time to improve behaviour.
- Tutors to monitor and challenge.

### Restorative

- 2 Behaviour points
- Logged on your profile
- Sticker in your planner to arrange restorative meeting. Teacher signs sticker to complete. Not attending will lead to intervention.

### Intervention

- 3 Behaviour points
- Logged on your profile
- Either failing restorative or refusing to continue learning elsewhere.
- 30 Minute detention the same day.
